

DUTIES OF CARETAKER

Washing:

1. Wash windows inside and outside once a year. (August)

2. Wash desks and woodwork once a year (Agust)

- 3. Wash and disinfect toilets twice a year (Aug. & Apr.)
- 4. Wash and oil floors four times a year. August, November, February and May. Oil more often if necessary.

- Cleaning: 1. Clean out pipes stoves or furnaces in August
 - 2. Clean the snow of steps and paths to toilets and gates.

Daily Work: Evenings:

- 1. Sweep floors in classrooms, cloakrooms and porches.
- 2. Dust blackboards, blackboard rails and blackboard brishes and dusters. NEVER WASH BLACKBOARDS WITH WATER.
- 3. Fill up wood boxes and prepare kindlings. Additional wood needed during the day to be brought by the older pupils in turn.
- 4. Empty water containers and pails. Any damages due to neglect of the caretaker will be charged against the caretaker.
- 5. Wash up wash basins.

Mernings:

1. Clean out ashes every morning

- 2. Start fires in sufficient time to have the rooms at a temperature of 68 degrees 15 minutes before opening of school.
 - 3. Dust teacher's desk, pupils' desks and seats and window sills and other furniture found in school.
 - 4. Fill up water containers, where water is obtained on the school yard or not farther then one-eighth of a mile.


CASUAL and General Work:

1. Minor repairs, tightening screws in desks, coat hooks heaters etc. repairing gate hinges, catches, door locks, door hooks, ttc. putting in window glass, and all minor repairs that may arise.

All work must be satisfactory to the teacher and the Local Board.

Kuthenia S.D. 2408 1911-1956 The Ruthenia District is located about 6 miles S.E. of the town of Smaky Lake and 25 mile surth of the north Sasketchewan Kiver in TSP. 58 and 59 Rige 16 and 17. It was settled by rekrainean and a few Komanian settlers between the years 1299-1905, This area was test suited for mired farming due to the different types of soil it consists of. It is rather level land with the Smaky Lake like running through, but has no lakes for fishing or recreational use as usual when an area was settled the need for a school soon arises. The pioneers were anxious that the Children receive an education, which many of them, themselves lacked in their homeland. Early in the year of 1911 a committee was formed for this purpose which consisted of Nikolai Galagan, Ivan Stucharuk Kefa Baleychuk and Teador Cebuliak and presented the government with this proposal. Mr. Cebuliak suggested that this school be named the Kuthenian School because the people that immigrated to Canada from the provinces of Ukraine were all referred to as Kuthenian at that time. On Cipil 15, 1911 it appeared in the Celberta Hazette that by order of the minister of Education D.S. Mackenge the following lands namely Lec. 31-32, 19, 29, 30 in TSP. 58 Rge 16 and Dec. 35, 36, 25, 26, TSP. 58 Rge 17, Sec 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 16, 17, 18 in Tsp. 59. Kge 16 and Dec. 1, 12, 13, in TSp. 59, Kge 17, West of 4th Mer. have been formed into a School District under the name of Kuthenia School Wistrict 76. 2408 of the Province of alberta, of enior drustee Mikolai Galagan , Pakan, alberta.

There were throughout Canada other areas and businesses having the name Ruthenian for example. The Canadian Ruthenian Newspaper, Winnipag Man. Kutheman Post Office in Manitala austro - Ruthenian S. D. # 2954 in Tsp. 55 Kge 5 west of 4c M. about 40 miles east of the town of Iwo Hiels. Kuthenian Leachers Training School 1915, 15 randon Man. appointed Robert Fletcher of Lamont to be the Official Trustee to conduct the affairs of the Kuthenia S.D. on Nov. 25, 1912 the Leputy Minister of Education authorized the Board of Trusties to borrow the sum of 4800,00 for the purpose of exectin Ind furnishing a school house and teacherage. The trusties hired a contractor from Bruiderhaus De then hired eight local teams, went to Bruiderheim and brought all the building material needed to build the school. He hered a few men and paid thom \$1.00 per day. The building was well under construction when one unfortunate day he came off the roof to do some sawing and suddenly callapsed and died. The school was left for others to finish off. This was a one room frame building, built on a stone foundation banked with earth to conserve heat. The school was open for teaching in 1913 and during the first few years school was taught only from april to Christmas. During this time the war broke out and all the ratipayers had to register at the school and fill out a form. Some of the first students attending school were from the following families. Basaraba, Balechowsky, Cebuliak, Chahley, Chiastka Dwernichek, Falebrenza, Gurmeza, Galagan, Kotek Kuzimsky Morgoch, Nickolychuk, Oleksuik, Ottowa, Palylyk Pillott, Pawlick, Prokopchuk, Romanchuk Rubuliak, Rusnak, Stacharuk, Vitvitsky, Viteychu Wasylinchuk, Wennek, Zytariek, Zukowsky. In the next few years the children of school age had increased and by the year

4) 1919 the student enrollment was more than 60 pupils. at this time the trustees decided that another school room was required and a more suitable and centralized site also. Then on march 11, 1920 the minister of Education concelled this site and on the same day approved another area on the S.E. corner of the S.E. 4 of Sec, in 1sp. 59-Rge 17, west of 4th M. a half mile south and one mile west on the farm of Gora Kogma Some of the ratepayers did not agree with the location so the miniter of Education again cancelled it and selected another sets a half mile east in the S.E corner of Dec 6, in Tsp. 59, Rge16 west of 4th M. where it is located to this day. In 1920, 2 acres of land were purchased from Mrs. Viteycheck and the trustees assigned Mr. John Palylyk to organize the moving of the school to the new site. IThe school was put on skinds and moved, by a few teams through Stacharuke and I urmega's farm to the new location. During these years some of the lands were lither added or withdrawn from the school district as the students could attend Kotzman school to the north or Victoria school to the south west in the Hudson Bay Keserve. On June 5, 1923 the Board of Public Utility 6 ommissioners had authorized the Board of Trustees of the Kuthenia School District to borrow the sum of 2,000.00 for the purpose of building another school and teacherage, as by this time there were over 10 pupils in one room.

In the late therties a horse barn was built and this was the fifth building on Lacres of las which left very little space for ball diamonds. The trustees applied for another addition of one acre of land and on sept 1, 1938 the minister of Education approved of this proposal, but it was not purchased, as in the early 40's the School District was centralized and some schools were moved into the town of Smaky Lake, others were sald to Community associations. Our Junior Room which was built in 1913 was moved to Smoky Lak and is still standing, back of the County Office. It was suggested to the Smoky Lake Cultural and Heritage Society to have it restored and considered as a local historic building, The senio room was kept and they continued teaching tell 1950 with Mary Pylypuik (Kuysowaty) being the last teacher. after 1950 it was used for meetings by the Farmers Union Local, which were mostly under the direction of Um. Nand mike J. Basaraba devoted members to the union and district. During this time the Smoky Lake School Division received approval from the Department of Education to sell any school property only to local chartered Organizations and they were given first priority. even if higher tenders are recevil. an individual would pay 100% of the reserve price, a Community Organization not chartered 1520 of reserve price and a Chartered Organization would pay 5020 of the reserve price. The people of the Kuthonic District wanted it to be donated, or bought for a

menimum legal amount because they owned it in the first place, but the School Board Committee disapproved of this peoposal and asked a reserve price of \$350.00 However the F. U.A. Local over 30 in number formed another organization. The Ruthenia Community Centre and purchased it in their name for the amount of 150.00 in 3 payments, and in July of 1960 received title to this property. There were many activities held in this school such as meetings by church groups, F.U.A. Ruthenia Community Centre political and agricultural, polling location, shows by lete Kohut of bings: pienics, and dances held to orchestia's like Metro Radomsky Woychuks, the blair of metro's trumpet to the Tune of The Star Spangled Banner would be heard for a mile around. The students were active in winter skating with home made skates which were made of a board and two heavy weres parallel under Some recalled doing janitor work for 2,000 month and during extremely cold temperature the classes sat by the heater, while their lunches frage in the clockroom. Some students recalled being strapped for speaking Ukrainian in school or the school yard. No one thought at that time that the second generation of the students would have to take Ukrainian classes in school to retain their language. Wood which was supplied to school by tend was 3 ft. long, split and piled into a cord 4x4x8 and was often sold at \$2.00 a cord. Many students were home made clothes, sweate scarves, metts and stockings were knitted of sheeps wo During the seemmer months the students walke bare footed to school. One student recalled being absent from school se the teacher asked. Why were you absent from scho yesterday? Pupil; The threshing machine was air our place: our place: Leacher, We'll couldn't the thrushing machine thrush without you? Papel; To, I was the bagger man, and hat to hold 1 ach ... hold socks. Such memories of the good old days still lenger on.
